\$20,000 ELEONORA CLASS

Eleonora is an exact replica of the schooner *Westward*. *Westward* was launched on March 31, 1910 as hull number 692 at the Herreshoff Manufacturing Co. in Bristol, Rhode Island. She was arguably one of the most famous and best known racing schooners in the world.



\$10,000 DORADE CLASS

Built in 1930 as the seventh design from Sparkman and Stephens, the 52-foot yawl *Dorada* represented Olin Stephens' ideal for a deep, sharp, and sturdy ocean racer. In recent years, *Dorada* has been meticulously restored and maintained and is back winning races again.



\$5,000 MADCAP CLASS

Designed by Fredrick Hoyt, *Madcap*, 6-meter #21, is shorter than most at 22 feet on the waterline with a 7-foot beam. In 2006, after 55 years of ownership, the Williams family generously donated *Madcap* to the IYRS Boatbuilding and Restoration Program. She spent most of 2007 and 2008 in the able hands of the second year students and now is as beautiful as the day she was built.



\$3,000 HERRESHOFF 12 1/2 CLASS

Nat Herreshoff designed the 12 1/2 footer in 1914. It has been in continuous production since then, and is nearly universally acclaimed as one of the finest small boats of all time. Currently, the second year students at IYRS are in the process of restoring a 12 1/2, *Hurrah*, which will be launched at the IYRS graduation in June.



\$1,000 BEETLE CAT® CLASS

The Beetle Cat is a 12 foot, gaff rigged, wooden sailboat first built in 1921 by the Beetle family of New Bedford, Massachusetts. The Beetle Cat is the foundation of the first year IYRS Boatbuilding and Restoration program. Students learn basic skills and return these wonderful little yachts to the water for enjoyment of sailors of all ages.
